
Growing Up In India Most Backward Caste



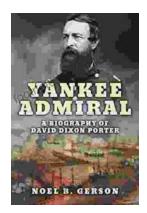
