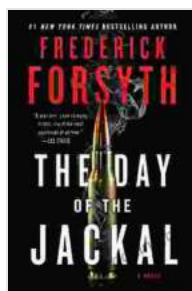


The Day of the Jackal: A Gripping Political Thriller

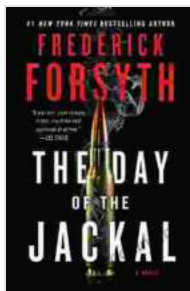

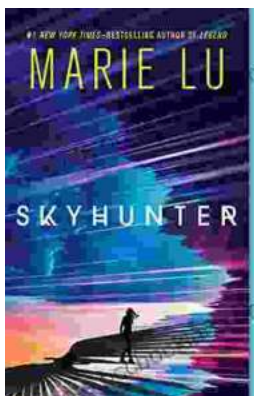
